March 12, 1689 - James II lands at Kinsale and proceeds to Dublin

March 17, 1882 – Newspaper told of the first formal St. Patrick's Day parade in Butte.

March 17, 1889 – Formal Dedication of Anaconda's AOH Hall.

The Thomas Francis Meagher Association announces details regarding upcoming MeagherFest '18. Saturday June 30, 2018. This international history/culture/arts exchange festival commemorates the life and legacy of Thomas Francis Meagher, the Irish patriot who became Montana's first acting territorial governor.

This first weekend in March was scheduled the annual "1848 Tricolour Celebration" in Waterford City, Ireland. Unfortunately, for the committee and all the people looking forward to celebrating all things Thomas Francis Meagher, the festival had to be cancelled due to snow. That's right, the "1848 Tricolour Celebration" was cancelled due to snow. This is in Waterford City, Ireland and not Montana. But we certainly have compassion for our friends in Ireland. We in Montana totally understand a snow storm completely stopping all scheduled plans.

MeagherFest '18 will take place June 30th in Helena Montana. So, save the date. This festival will coincide with the 170th anniversary of Meagher flying the Irish Tricolour for the first time at 33 The Mall, Waterford City, Ireland.

Meagher's brief but colorful life touches three continents and his legacy remains as relevant today as a century and a half ago, especially for Montana. His legislation, often bitterly contested, laid the groundwork for Yellowstone Park, the Montana National Guard, religious and education reform, Native American relations and ultimately, Montana statehood.

Festival events include, but are not limited to historical presentations, demonstrations, guided tours to relative historic sites, panel discussion by field experts, music, dance and poetry, kids' activities, and more.

CATHEDRAL OF ST HELENA AND

THE FEAST DAY OF ST PATRICK

It is very special to be able to celebrate the feast day of St Patrick at the Cathedral of St



Patrick, but also the statutes of Daniel O'Connell, the Great Irish Liberator and John Barry, the father of United States Navy. John Barry is from County Wexford, Ireland.

What is so special to celebrate the St Patrick's Day mass at the Cathedral is that it has a relic of St Patrick.

Relics are classified into three classes. The first being the physical remains of the saint. The Cathedral's St Patrick's relic is a first-class relic. The Cathedral of St Helena was dedicated on Christmas Day in 1914. The following June the Cathedral received the St Patrick's relic from Rome. With all the connections the Cathedral has to Ireland and having the relic of St Patrick just makes you feel that much closer to the Patron Saint of Ireland.

Helena. The Cathedral has many connections to Ireland that you may not know existed.

It starts with Thomas Francis Meagher wanting the church to create a diocese in the Montana Territory and writing letters that moved that reality forward. We have people like Thomas Cruse that was the major contributor to the building of the Cathedral of St Helena. Thomas Cruse was from County Cavan, Ireland.

We have many details of the Cathedral of St Helena that have a relation to Ireland. The beautiful stain glass window depicting St Patrick on Easter Sunday at the Hill of Tara in County Meath, Ireland using a shamrock to explain the mystery of the Holy Trinity. Also, some of the statuary on the outside of the Cathedral. Of course, there is St
