Message from the President

As we celebrate the feast day of Saint Brigid in the month of February and prepare for the month of Saint Patrick, I reflect on our 'Irishness'. It conjures up sixteen hundred years of what I know, don't know and what I have been taught to believe.

As the lives of Ireland's three greatest saints, Patrick, Brigid and Columba blend together, we are meshed into the fabric of our traditions and faith. They form the bonds of our brotherhood and link us to generations of our ancestors.

Born into slavery, Saint Brigid fed the poor and healed them. Her reputation for sanctity and her renown of unbounded charity drew multitudes of the poor to Kildare. She was the founder of the first Irish monastery in County Kildare. She is most known to us for a cross she fashioned from simple reeds for a dying pagan chieftain.

As each single reed Saint Brigid weaved into a cross was by itself weak, several woven together in the Cross created a much stronger bond. So too are we bound by the Cross, and by our tradition. We add our strands to the Cross, blend our work into the cloth and pass it to the next generation. It is in the spirit of Saint Brigid, through our Thanksgiving and Easter Blessings, we bring succor to those who struggle. James 2:14-26

As our bonds are born in the Faith and forever in our heritage, so too we must serve in Friendship, Unity and Christian Charity.

This Month in Irish History

- February 1st St Brigid's Day This is heralded as the first day of Spring (Imbolc). Similar to the United States groundhog tradition, if a hedgehog came out of his burrow on St. Brigid's Day.
- February 1, 1796 Theobald Wolf Tone, United Irish leader, arrives in France seeking assistance
- February 2, 1880 Charles S. Parnell addresses the U.S. Congress

February 2, 1882 – James Joyce, Irish author born.

February 4, 1868 - Birth of Irish patriot and revolutionary, Countess Constance Markievicz, née Gore-Booth. Constance was the first woman to be elected to Westminster Parliament in London (where she refused to take her seat)

February 4, 1775 – Robert Emmet, Irish patriot born.

February 6, 1685 – Coronation of King James II

- February 6, 1877 John O'Mahoney, Irish patriot, died in New York City
- February 8, 1587 Mary Stuart, Queen of Scots, executed by the English.

February 13, 1689 - William and Mary - daughter of James II - are proclaimed king and queen jointly.
February 23, 1965 - Roger Casement's body is returned from England to be re-interred at Glasnevin Cemetery in Dublin
February 24, 1692 - The Treaty of Limerick is ratified by William of Orange.
February 26,1854 - William Smith O'Brien, leader of the 1848 rebellion, is pardoned.
February 28, 1884 - Seán MacDiarmada, revolutionary, is born in Kiltycolgher, Co. Leitrim

In Memoriam



January 17, 1934 – January 31, 2020

The Archdiocese of Seattle announced that Archbishop Brunett died in the peace of our Lord last week.

He was appointed bishop of Helena, Montana, by Pope John Paul II in 1994. He was appointed archbishop of Seattle on October 28, 1997 and installed December 18, 1997.

The Thomas Francis Meagher Division created an annual award that reflects the words of Jesus and their Irish culture. It is awarded to honor an individual in Montana who has done the most to eliminate injustice in the struggle for civil rights and human dignity. The honoree is awarded with the Alexander J. Brunett Medal for Social Justice each year at their Charter dinner. This award commenced in 1998 and is still awarded today.
