Message from the President

Combined President and Veterans Notes

All,

Today is June 6, 2022, the Anniversary of D-Day in Normandy in 1944. A day of terrible sacrifice and yet one of the most important exertions that the United States has ever undertaken. Many other events occurred on this day in History, including the Battle of Belleau Wood in 1918 in WWI and the attempted assassination of James Meredith, a Civil Rights Activist, at the start of his "March Against Fear" in 1966. In 1833, Andrew Jackson became the first US President to ride on an Iron Horse, a pleasure trip to Baltimore.

As you can see, many of these events have changed history. While today we focus on the Landings in Normandy, we also need to be mindful of the other events that have occurred in our history and remember the impact that they have had on us not only as Americans, but also as those of Irish decent. So many events have shaped our lives and the direction of the world that it is almost impossible to isolate any one factor when we are talking about who and what we are as Irish Americans. We need to look at the wholistic version of history and try to glean some of the lessons that we can, for those that fail to remember their history are doomed to repeat it.

For example, we know that the history of the Irish in America is littered with tragic incidents similar to that of James Meredith, but we were able to overcome those issues and there were many Irish Americans who helped the Civil Rights Movement in the US, John F. Kennedy, to mention just one.

This Month in Irish History

June 1, 1866 – American Fenians invade Canada.

June 1, 1919 - Eamon DeValera begins his tour of the USA to raise money and support for the IRA's war against England. He stops in Butte, Montana.

June 3rd – Feast of St Kevin – he is the patron of blackbirds, the archdiocese of Dublin and Glendalough, County Wicklow.

June 5, 1868 - James Connolly born of Irish parents in Edinburgh.

June 6, 1800 - Ordination of the first priests at St Patrick's College, Maynooth. The college was founded in 1795 as the National Seminary for Ireland.

June 8, 1853 - John Mitchel escaped from Australia, eventually settling in the United States.

June 14, 1690 - William of Orange lands at Carrickfergus

June 21, 1877 - On a day that will long be remembered as Black Thursday, four members of the Molly Maguires - Alexander Campbell, John Donohue, Michael Doyle and Edward Kelly, shackled with chains, walk to the gallows specially constructed to accommodate four people: their lives are ended at the same split second

June 23, 1704 - The Registration Act comes into force requiring all Catholic priests in Ireland to register in court, to furnish two £50 bonds for good behavior, and not to leave the county in which they are registered.
