- February 1st St Brigid's Day This is heralded as the first day of Spring (Imbolc). Similar to the United States groundhog tradition, if a hedgehog came out of his burrow on St. Brigid's Day.
- February 1, 1796 Theobald Wolf Tone, United Irish leader, arrives in France seeking assistance
- February 2, 1880 Charles S. Parnell addresses the U.S. Congress
- February 2, 1882 James Joyce, Irish author born.
- February 4, 1868 Birth of Irish patriot and revolutionary, Countess

 Constance Markievicz, née Gore-Booth.

 Constance was the first woman to be elected
 to Westminster Parliament in London (where
 she refused to take her seat)
- February 4, 1775 -Robert Emmet, Irish patriot born.
- February 6, 1685 Coronation of King James II
- February 6, 1877 John O'Mahoney, Irish patriot, died in New York City
- February 8, 1587 Mary Stuart, Queen of Scots, executed by the English.
